| Suspected Cases Further spread of the virus within the setting Panic among staff & parents | 12. Setting manager to review practises daily 1. Identify isolation area close to entrance or outside 2. Isolation box to contain PPE mask, visor, apron, gloves, snack & water 3. Child showing symptoms will be immediately isolated 4. Staff member showing symptoms will be sent home 5. Staff member to sit with child wearing following PPE- Mask, visor, gloves, apron 6. Parents will be notified for immediate collection 7. Area to be deep cleaned following incident 8. Setting to be deep cleaned following confirmed case 9. All materials used to be double bagged and placed in refuse 10. Liaise with AM to ensure parent/staff communications are in place |
